WHAT DOES FIRST HERITAGE CREDIT DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Social Security number and employment ■ Account balances and payment history ■ Credit history and income <p>When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons First Heritage Credit chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Who we are

Who is providing this notice?

First Heritage Credit; First Heritage Credit of Mississippi; First Heritage Credit of Louisiana; and First Heritage Credit of Tennessee (all LLCs).

What we do

How does First Heritage Credit protect my personal information?

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

How does First Heritage Credit collect my personal information?

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- Apply for a loan or give a Social Security Number
- Give contact information or give debt and asset information
- Give employment and income information

We also collect information from other sources, such as a credit report from a credit bureau and loan or payment history from other creditors.

Why can't I limit all sharing?

Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes—information about your creditworthiness
- affiliates from using your information to market to you
- sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.

Definitions

Affiliates

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *Outside of the First Heritage Credit branch network, our affiliates would include: System Support, LLC (non-financial).*

Nonaffiliates

Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *First Heritage Credit does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.*

Joint marketing

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.

- *First Heritage Credit does not jointly market.*

Other important information
